Ullet Road Church is committed to protecting your personal data and respecting your privacy. This notice explains what information we collect, why we collect it, and how we use it.

What Information We Collect

We may collect and process contact details, information relating to church activities, safeguarding-related information where necessary, and CCTV images captured on our premises.

Why We Collect This Information

We collect personal data to support the life and work of the church, organise services and events, ensure safety and wellbeing, meet legal obligations, and protect people and property.

CCTV

Ullet Road Church operates CCTV for the purposes of safety, safeguarding, and the prevention and detection of crime. CCTV cameras operate both inside and outside the church building, including entrances, corridors, and surrounding areas. In some cases, this may include limited coverage of adjacent public spaces. Footage is recorded continuously and retained for 21 days, after which it is automatically deleted unless required for a lawful purpose. Access is strictly controlled and limited to authorised personnel.

How We Share Information

We do not share personal data routinely. However, information may be shared where necessary with trusted service providers, insurers, police, or statutory authorities. We may also share information where there is a safeguarding concern or where it is necessary to protect individuals from harm. Any such sharing will be limited, proportionate, and in accordance with safeguarding guidance and legal obligations.

How We Store and Protect Your Data

We take appropriate measures to ensure personal data is stored securely, accessed only when necessary, and protected from loss or misuse. Data is retained only as long as required for its purpose.

Your Rights

You have the right to request access to your personal data, request correction, request deletion where appropriate, and object to or restrict certain types of processing.

Complaints

If you are unhappy with how your data has been handled, you have the right to complain to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO).

Updates

This Privacy Notice will be reviewed periodically and updated as required.
